

## **Copeland Homes**

### **European Neighbours Day 27<sup>th</sup> May 2018**

Copeland Homes housing stock is based in the West of Cumbria on the edge of the Lake District National Park. This is a rural area consisting of small towns and villages along a coastal strip. Several of the neighbourhoods we manage have high levels of deprivation and the associated problems.

We used the Neighbours Day banner to encourage residents to come together and celebrate their community and support the development of community spirit. We choose to support small neighbourhood events where residents would take ownership of developing their own activities. As an organisation we host an annual Funday in the Park which attracts thousands of local residents this took place a week later.

We developed a Neighbours Day challenge and invited community groups to apply for funding offering 10 groups £200 towards the costs of the events.

#### **The challenge**

We challenge your Group to bring together a cross section of people in your neighbourhood to a social gathering where they can have fun, make new friends and be entertained. The events could take place during the week 25<sup>th</sup> – 31<sup>st</sup> May.

We also offered development support to those groups who needed it but most groups were confident that they could do it on their own. Each group was provided with a scrap book and two disposable cameras to assist them in producing a record of the event. A member of Copeland Homes Regeneration Team attended each events providing moral support and in some cases practical help.

#### **Marketing and Publicity**

Groups used the Neighbours Day posters to advertise their events and one group had an article in the Whitehaven News prior to the event. Copeland Homes sent a press release to the local papers with the schedule of events. The Whitehaven news promoted Neighbours day but did not publish the event details. The Neighbours Day name badges were widely used. An article reporting on the events will be published in two tenant publications CHAT and YOU.

#### **Events**

All events went ahead on schedule although one or two had to be adapted at the last minute as outdoor activities had to be cancelled due to adverse weather conditions. Please see attached schedule of activities.

693 residents including volunteers attended the 10 events.

Several groups were disappointed with the turn out but all are keen to participate in something similar next year and some groups are already planning next years activity.

**Examples of success:**

- Greenbank Community Association invited residents to a luncheon and talk on “Greenbank past and present”. The day was a great success and residents have requested another day, including those people who did not attend. Some of their older residents now living in sheltered housing or Care Homes also want to attend future events. Their regular luncheon club numbers have grown significantly and they are now planning another event for September where they will use community transport to pick up older residents now living outside the Greenbank community.
- North Copeland Youth Partnership worked with community members to organise a fun day, which was so successful they are already planning a Mardi Gras for next year.

**Conclusion**

I am pleased with the outcomes the initiative has been a success on several fronts:

- It has met its objectives of bringing together a cross section of neighbourhoods to a social gathering where they can have fun, make new friends and be entertained.
- It has promoted the community organisations within their neighbourhoods.
- It has empowered both individuals and organisations.
- It has fostered community cohesion.

We have received positive feedback from most groups who are eager to take part next year, we are also interested in repeating the exercise next year. We would encourage groups to take up our support to organise and market their events.
